CHWs are Trusted Peers Who


- Serve as a link between health and social services and their community.

Program Type	New Workforce Development AmeriCorps Apprentice
Who It's For	This role is ideal for internships , practicums , or temporary positions that create pathways for graduate students or individuals beginning their public health careers.
	It's designed for candidates with little to no professional experience who are eager to learn and contribute to public health. Participants can be enrolled as AmeriCorps Apprentices to receive a living allowance during their service and an education award upon completion.
Eligibility	 Must be at least 17 years old at the start of service. Must have a high school diploma or equivalent or agree to obtain one before using the education award. Must be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or lawful permanent resident alien. Must pass a National Service Criminal History Check. Individuals convicted of murder or listed on a sex offender registry are not eligible.
Length of Program	Starting January 1, 2026 – December 31, 2026
Employer & Trainee Compensation	 8 months (150 hours per month) ≥ 1200 total hours = \$12,200 per member 6 months (150 hours per month) ≥ 900 total hours = \$900 per member Award dependent*

*The option includes a living allowance for apprentices, related instruction, career coaching, and preparation for CHW assessment. AmeriCorps options are available to 501c3 organizations to have participant benefits partially underwritten through federal funding.
